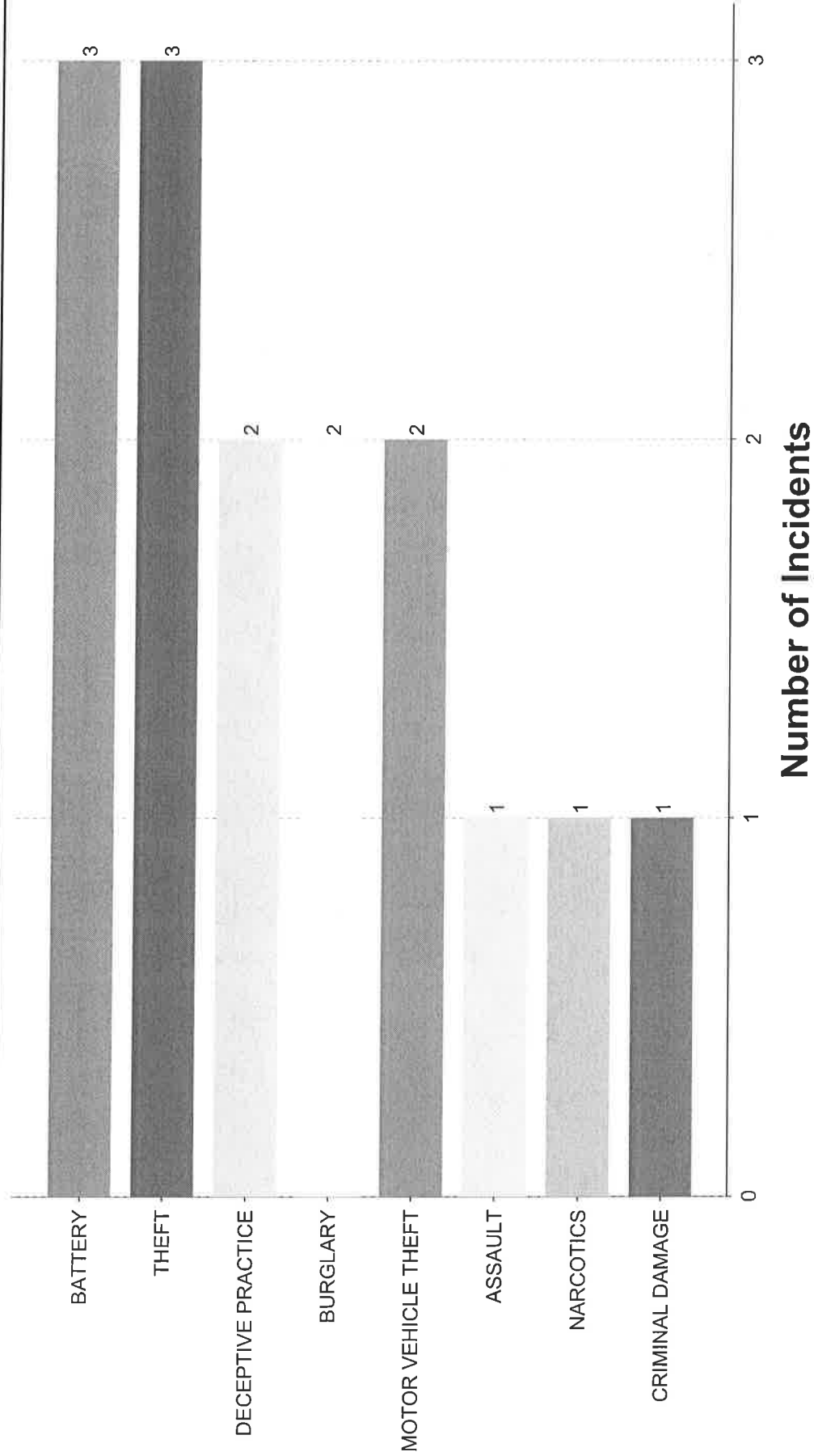

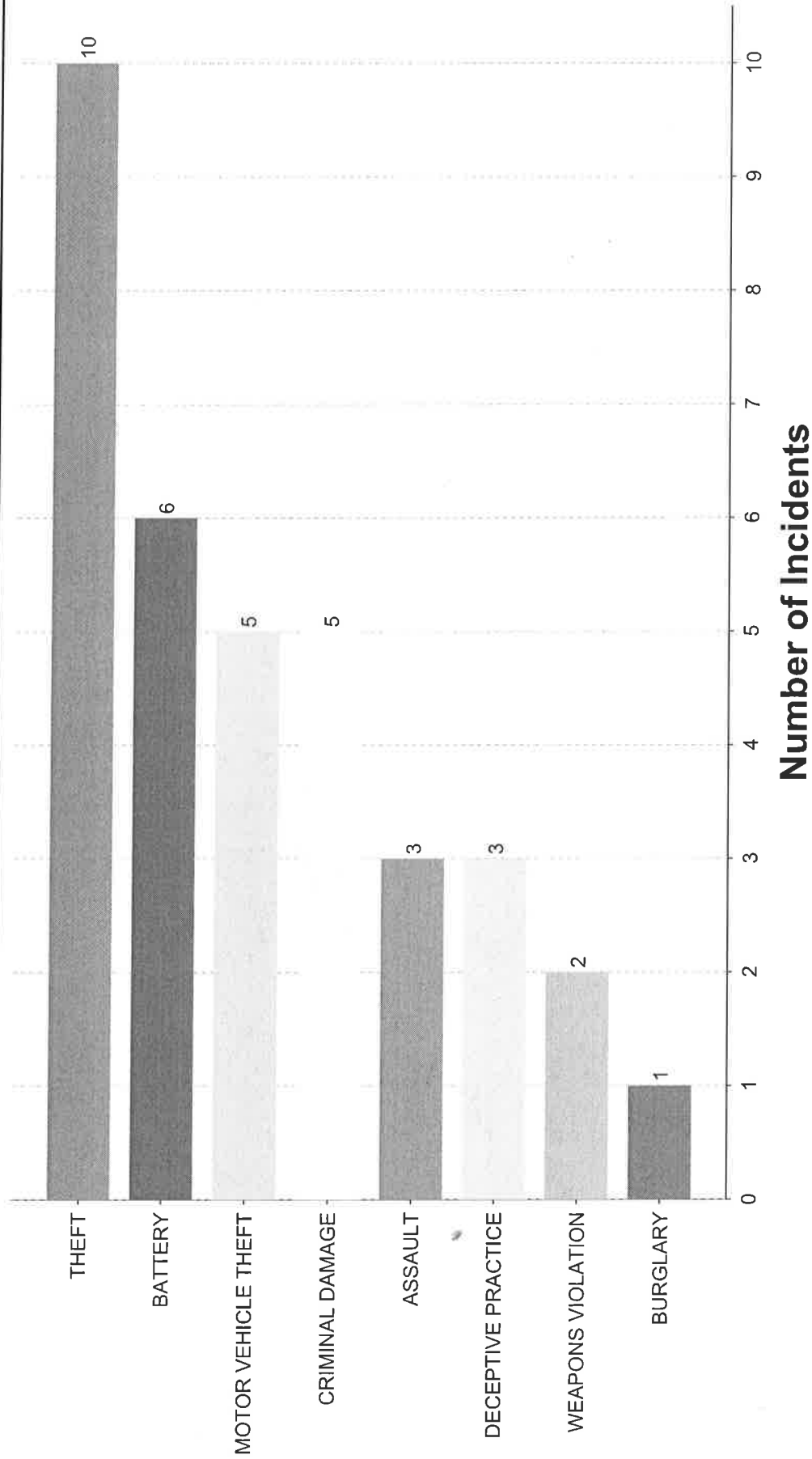

About the Crime:

This alert gives notice to landscaping service providers in the 014th, 016th and 017th Districts of thefts/robbery related incidents of equipment from residential yards or trucks. In these incidents the offender(s) approached the landscaping truck and/or crew working in a residential yard and removed concrete saws and/or other equipment. In one incident an offender implied that he had a handgun, while the second offender removed a concrete saw from yard. In these incidents the offender(s) fled in a black and/or blue sedan.

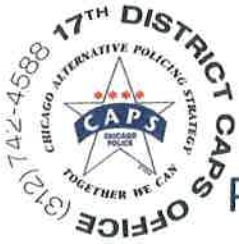

When Walking:

- Using dark areas, streets or alleys
- Walk alone
- Phone Distractions:
Texting, Talking, Loud Music, Looking Down
- Showing valuables:
Electronics, Jewelry, Cash/Wallets/Purses

When Driving:

- Leaving doors unlocked, or windows down
- Leaving valuables visible
- Leaving vehicle running or unattended

When Using Public Transportation:

- Phone Distractions:
Texting, Talking, Loud Music, Looking Down
- Showing valuables:
Electronics, Jewelry, Cash/Wallets/Purses

When At Home:

- Leaving doors unlocked, or windows open
- Open the door for strangers:
People you do not recognize, false utility workers, any unexpected package deliveries
- Leave garage unlocked or door open

When Using Public Transportation:

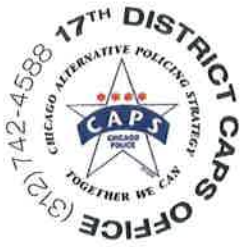
- Pay attention to your surroundings *At All Times*

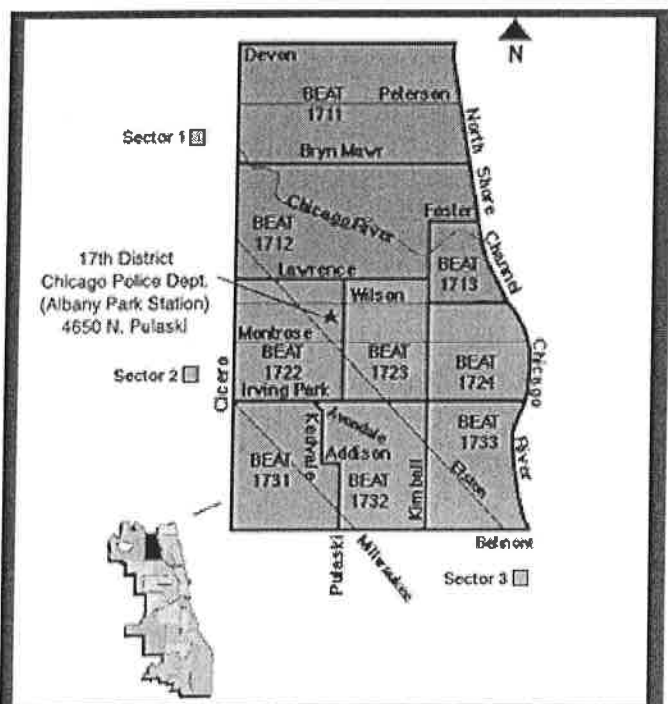
