

HISTORY OF NLU



Early Childhood Education

- Prepares students to work with children birth to Grade 2 and leads to the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) Professional Educator's License (PEL), with an endorsement in ECE.
- Coursework leads to the Gateways to Opportunity Level 5 ECE Credential.
- The program is practice-based so that students gain experience working in all age ranges of the License: birth-to-three, preschool and school-based K-2. In many cases, field hours can be completed in your place of employment.
- Students can pursue a concentration in either Special Education, ESL/Bilingual Education that lead to the LBS1 and/or ESL/Bil subendorsements, or Early Care and Education Administration (for the Gateways Director's Credential Level 1)

This major is ideal for students that want to work with children in school-based settings (Pre-K to Grade 2)

Elementary Education

- Prepares students to work with children in grades 1-6, and leads to the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE)
 Professional Educator's License (PEL), with an endorsement in ELE.
- The program is practice-based so that students gain experience working in all multiple classrooms between grades 1-6.
- Students can pursue a concentration in either Special or ESL/Bilingual Education that lead to the LBS1 and/or ESL/Bil sub-endorsements.

This major is ideal for students that want to work with children in school-based settings (Grades 1-6)





B.A. Early Childhood and Elementary Education

- This new "double major" program-- secures a subsequent endorsement that will allow you to teach birth through grade 6 and leads to the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) Professional Educator's License (PEL), with an endorsement in ECE and ELE.
- Field hours need to be completed in both age/grade ranges: ECE and ELE.
- In order to earn both the ECE and ELE endorsements, 2 content tests will be required (Content Test #206 and Content Test #305).
- The program is practice-based so that students gain experience working in multiple classrooms between birth and grade 6
- Students can pursue a concentration in either Special or ESL/Bilingual Education that lead to the LBS1 and/or ESL/Bil subendorsements.



Secondary Education

 This new program will begin fall 2022* and prepare students to teach grades 9-12 in a math or English content area.

 Students can also attain a subsequent endorsement in Middle Grades Education (math or English) as well.

Early Childhood Education Remote Accelerated Program for Students Working in the Field

- Students will be able to engage in something called "Prior Learning Assessment"
 (PLA), which allows them to use their work experience and prior knowledge of
 working with children to demonstrate their competency in key areas of ECE teacher
 preparation. All while gaining college credit!
- This process will accelerate the path toward degree completion. In addition, through the use of a residency model allowing you to gain experience and further practice—in your own center or school, you will also complete teaching methods courses and specialized courses for understanding the important birth to-three years of the ECE spectrum.

If you work or have worked in early childhood education and you're seeking additional credentials and/or a degree in early childhood education, you may be eligible for the Early Childhood Access Consortium for Equity (ECACE) Scholarship Program.



Infant-Toddler Studies

- Prepares students to work with children birth to age five, with special emphasis on the first three years.
- Aligned to several state and nationally recognized credentials:
 - Gateways to Opportunity: ECE, Level 5
 - Gateways to Opportunity: Infant Toddler, Level 5
 - Gateways to Opportunity Illinois Director, Level 1--with ECE Administration as chosen concentration
- AIM4Excellence National Director's Credential
- NEW: State of Illinois Early Intervention/Developmental Therapy
- The program is practice-based so that students gain experience working in multiple ECE settings. Experience in 0-3 and 3-5 are integral to the program. In most cases, field hours can be completed in your place of employment.

This major is ideal for students that want to work with children and families in community based settings, focused on birth to three.

Applied Education Studies

- Prepares students to work in ECE settings that include family support services.
- Leads to two statewide credentials:
- Gateways to Opportunity: ECE, Level 5
- Gateways to Opportunity: Level 5 Family Specialist Credential (FSC)
- Prepares students for the following National Credential exams (taken separately from the program):
- Certified Family Life Educator (CFLE)
- Child Family Life Credential
- Students choose from several concentrations depending upon their interest: Pre-School Teaching and Learning, Infant-Toddler Studies, and Early Childhood Administration.

This major is ideal for students that want to work with children and families in education adjacent roles such as social service, community based family support, and home visiting.



Are there opportunities to have my Direct Loans forgiven? There are several opportunities for loan forgiveness. Teachers may qualify for forgiveness of up to \$17,500.00 or if you are a Public Service employee and make 120 consecutive payments, your remaining loan balance may be canceled. Your loan servicer will be able to assist you with loan forgiveness options.



FAFSA or RISE/ ALTERNATIVE APPLICATION

- Complete a free application at Fill out FAFSA Form (school code: 001733)
- Online (www.fafsa.ed.gov) application takes 2–3 weeks to process.
- Complete the 2020-21 & 2021 22 FAFSA -You MUST complete a new application for each year you wish to be eligible for aid.
- Students must be fully admitted and registered for classes to be eligible for financial aid
